It is hard to believe what God has accomplished through this frail and relatively insignificant organization in the few short years since 2011 when DM2 began.

We now have eight official Regional Ministry directors, along with a host of volunteer teachers. While I direct our work in Bolivia, Tommy Northcott directs Sierra Leone, John Clark - Liberia, David Howard - Zambia, Brad Rigby - Myanmar, Mark Musser - Ukraine and countries in the former Soviet Union, John Wry - Canada, and Carlos Tellez - Latin America at large. In Uganda, Mexico, Paraguay and Brazil, DM2 works in an advisory role with various local churches. Panama, India and Germany are additional prospects for future ministry.

On a local level, numerous churches host workshops to train both youth and adults to become effective disciple-makers in North America. Young adults have started ministries on a couple of college campuses.

When DM2 started, our objective was to have a ten-year program with two workshops a year per field, beginning with Bolivia. To keep up with this "unrealistic" goal, two curriculums had to be developed yearly. Thanks to God's miraculous workings, contributions of His faithful servants and much hard work, we now have surveys of the Old and New Testaments, a panorama of the life of Christ, and verse by verse studies for Daniel, Romans, 1 Corinthians, Galatians, Colossians, Hebrews and Revelation. (These courses can be made available to you upon request.) This coming year our plan is to develop curriculums for 1 Timothy and Titus and a Bible study method's course.

Each curriculum comes with a set of PowerPoints which we pass on free of charge to future disciple-makers for their use. Each Regional Ministry Director is responsible for getting the curriculum translated for his field or area when that is necessary. Consequently, we have materials in tribal dialects like Chen, Telugu, Bemba and Simba Guarani, as well as in national languages like Spanish, German, Portuguese and Russian.

All of this is a testimony to God's faithfulness and your prayers and partnership with DM2. Truly when He opens a door, no one can shut it. It was Christ who commanded us to go make disciples of all nations and He provides all we need to fulfill this directive. *So then neither he one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but God who causes the growth.* 1 Corinthians 3:7

## Mark Musser Ukraine 2017

Our last trip to Ukraine began in Lviv, on the Polish border, and ended in Kiev. It was an incredible time of teaching, discipling and fellowship. After all was said and done, we ended with an open door into a new church and significant inroads into another. We taught Hebrews, Galatians and the Panorama of the Life of Christ.

Besides the four American teachers, eleven Ukrainians from different parts of the country also helped teach. We rejoice to see these teachers steadily grow in the Lord and improve their skills. Three of them in particular are becoming very adept at using the DM2 methodology.

As the workshops continue to expand into more places, I find myself doing less of the actual teaching at each location. While the groups we teach are never large, they are multiplying, which certainly makes it challenging to manage. One of the weeks was virtually "controlled chaos." I traveled back and forth between workshops, each with different schedules, different teachers and different courses. Thankfully, DM2's method of multiplying disciple-makers expands our pool of available teachers very quickly, thus spreading out the work load. What was accomplished in that short time will hopefully result in lasting benefits for those who endured the long hours.

Andy Stacy, from our home church in Olympia, Grace Redeemer Bible Church, was a great help. It was his first mission trip to Ukraine. He helped teach Galatians in Baryshivka and the Panorama of the Life of Christ in Kiev. It was a blessing to have Andy on the team. After hearing about ministry in Ukraine for so long, he finally got to experience it firsthand.

Austin Norgaard from Colorado Christian University also joined us. Though he has been to Ukraine before, he had never taught using the DM2

style. Austin was a real blessing for the team. He also taught in both Baryshivka and Kiev.

As is my custom when I go to Ukraine, I taught my Life of Christ curriculum at the Word of God Bible College, a ministry of Jim and Phyllis Myers. During this time, we took advantage of the nights and weekends to practice what we were learning by going and making disciples in other locations. It was a wonderful testimony to Andy and Austin and my entire Bible college class. This kind of mission work perfectly matches Christ's ministry of making disciple-makers.

It has been my long-term desire to incorporate graduates from the Word of God Bible College into ministry. DM2 has provided the needed ministry platform, making it possible for Bible training and ministry to progress seamlessly from theoretical to the practical.

Several students who now attend the Word of God Bible College were previously DM2 teachers and participants. Since it is difficult to recruit committed students for the Bible College, this has been an added, yet unforeseen, blessing, highlighting how two ministries in the body of Christ can work together to further the Gospel in faraway places like Ukraine.

My wife Caren and daughter Rachel have already purchased tickets for Ukraine so they can join me on my next trip. During spring break they hope to do a Women of the Word workshop in Baryshivka with a group of faithful older women who are a strong support to their growing church.

From my perspective, this last DM2 trip to Ukraine was the most encouraging so far. I saw God work on so many fronts and in so many situations. All of this is courtesy of God's matchless and infinite grace. In every workshop, we emphasized this concept: *but may it never be that I should boast, except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.* Galatians 6:14
